

## 2026 UAW Constitutional Convention: CAPS-UAW Resolution and Amendments Procedure

The UAW hosts a constitutional convention every four years in Detroit where amendments to the UAW constitution are considered and adopted and where resolutions for priorities and programs for the Union are also considered and adopted. Amendments to the Constitution are specific amendments that are offered to the UAW's constitution ([linked here](#)). Resolutions are commitments to various policies and programs that the Union can take up.

In order for amendments or resolutions to be considered at the convention, local unions must submit the said resolution or amendment for consideration after it had been adopted by its membership. Membership, in this context, means a membership body, like a Joint Council or the Statewide Membership.

For CAPS-UAW, 1115, the Executive Board has adopted the following process to consider resolutions and amendments for adoption as a local union:

- Resolutions or Amendments must be submitted to the Union's Recording Secretary at [Recording.Secretary@capsscienists.org](mailto:Recording.Secretary@capsscienists.org) by **March 23rd, 2026**
- All resolutions and amendments to be considered must be co-signed by five (5) or more CAPS-UAW members
- At a special Executive Board meeting in March (**March 25th, 2026**), properly submitted resolutions and amendments will be considered and agendized for consideration at the Local Union's Statewide Membership Meeting on **April 11th**
- Resolutions and Amendments may be amended or adopted at the Local Union's Statewide Membership Meeting\*
- Resolutions and Amendments must be received by the International Union's Secretary Treasurer via surface mail by May 4th, 2026 in Detroit, Michigan

\*Resolutions and amendments may also be adopted by membership action at a subsequent Joint Council meeting, if later resolutions are necessary.
